

MINER BURIED 14 HOURS UNDER 40 CARLOADS OF COAL TAKEN OUT UNHURT

SCRANTON, Sept. 8.—Joe Oinesky, a Polish laborer in the North End coal company's mine, was caught beneath a fall of coal at 2 o'clock this morning and was not released until 4 o'clock this afternoon, after forty carloads of coal and rock had been dug from around him. Remarkable to relate, he was not hurt, having been saved from injury by the fact that two big slabs of rock formed a sort of tent over him. His head was reached long before he was finally extricated, and he received the last sacraments of the Catholic church, from his pastor, Rev. Anthony Kaupus, who braved the danger of the disturbed roof falling at any moment, that he might administer to the supposed dying man.
