

IMPRISONED IN TUNNEL

**TWO ITALIAN LABORERS CAUGHT
BY CAVE-IN RESCUED BY
SWIMMERS.**

New York, Dec. 20.—Three swimmers yesterday rescued two Italian laborers, who for more than forty hours had been imprisoned in the East river tunnel of the Pennsylvania railroad by a cave-in at the Long Island City end of the underwater bore.

A large force of men had been sinking a shaft to rescue the imprisoned men and powerful pumps were kept running constantly in an effort to lower the water level in the tunnel. A boat could not be forced into the tunnel and three men volunteered to swim in. They did so and returned soon after carrying the two upon their backs.
