

HAD PREMONITION OF DEATH; QUIT THE MINE IN TIME

August Beam, a miner, well known throughout this section of the west, arrived in Trinidad from Raton, says the Advertiser. He had been employed for some few months in the "Old Dutchman" mine at Blossburg, where half a dozen miners lost their lives in an explosion last Thursday morning.

"I quit about two weeks ago," said Beam in the Advertiser office last night. "I made good money there, but I became fearful of just some such accident. Gas was always about and I decided to get out. I cannot tell you how glad I am that I acted on my presentiments."

Beam formely worked at Gray Creek and is an experienced man. He will remain in this city for several days, not yet having made up his mind where he will go. His family live at Cripple Creek. Mr. Beam is the father of "Kid" Beam, the prize fighter.
