

HOUSES BLOWN UP.

They Tottered on the Edge of the Haverstraw Clay Pit.

Haverstraw, N. Y., Jan. 13.—The houses still standing on the edge of the clay pit into which a large section of land and several houses were precipitated by a landslide last Monday night, were today blown up with dynamite. These houses were loosened from their foundations by the cave-in and were considered unsafe for any one to venture into. A large double brick house and a smaller frame structure were both blown up today.

The body of David Aidenbaum, the sixth victim recovered from the landslide, was today sent to Brooklyn for burial. It is learned that he was a peddler who stopped overnight at Haverstraw in one of the houses which fell into the clay pit.
