

MINER BURIED ALIVE.

Henry Drew in Cave-in at Ontario Mine Miraculously Escapes.

Park City, Jan. 17.—Henry Drew, twenty-five years of age, had a narrow escape in the Ontario mine at 8 o'clock this morning. Several tons of dirt and rock came down, knocking him over and burying him up to the chin. His light was extinguished, and for several minutes he lay in the darkness, expecting that at every moment more rock would come down and bury him alive, before his partner could summon a party to rescue him. The party was soon called, however, and for two hours they worked desperately to release the imprisoned miner. When he was finally released he was carried through the tunnel on a truck, and conveyed to his mother's home in Chambers street. Dr. Bardsley was called to attend the injured man. Examination showed that Drew was badly bruised about the shoulders and legs, but, otherwise, he appears to be uninjured.
