

**BURIED FOR HOURS BY
CAVE-IN; ALL RESCUED.**

SAN FRANCISCO.—After being buried for four hours beneath an immense cave-in on the side of a hill at Winnehaven, near Point Richmond, three workmen were dug out of their earthy prison Friday in a terrible state of injury and exhaustion.

Their names are E. Steele, C. Duggan and P. O'Brien. The former was so badly crushed that he will die. The legs and arms of the others were broken and they were bruised. They will recover, though they may be crippled for life.

The men were engaged in blasting away part of a hill where the California Wine association is to build a winery, and failed to reach a place of safety after lighting a fuse.

The explosion tore away the side of the hill and buried the three men under a great mass of earth and rocks. When rescued they were more dead than alive.
