

Twenty-Nine Bodies Taken From Mine

Nineteen Men and Five Mules Found Dead a Mile From the Entrance.

Received Over the Mail's Leased Wire.

McALESTER, Okla., August 27.—

When the rescuers had completed their work at Hailey-Ola coal mine No. 1 at Haileyville, fourteen miles east of here, where a disastrous explosion occurred yesterday, twenty-nine dead bodies had been removed. The last body was taken out at an early hour this morning.

It is now believed that the last man has been accounted for, and that there are no other bodies in the mine.

When the mine was finally cleared of smoke late yesterday, nineteen of the dead miners were found with five mules huddled together in one of the entrances a mile from the opening. They had started toward the fire instead of making a detour.

Most of the bodies of the dead miners will be interred to-day, a necessity, as they have undergone rapid decomposition since they were removed from the mine.

Haileyville to-day is filled with thousands of people, most of whom came from miles around to view the bodies or out of mere curiosity.
