

24 Hours in Water; Miner Rescued.
Scranton, Pa., Oct. 9.—Knowing that his one chance of being found lay in standing in a channel which his rescuers would follow, Patrick Hart, aged seventy years, of Carbondale, stood in water up to his waist for twenty-four hours in the Wilson Creek mine. His fellow workmen missed him, and when a systematic search finally led them to the spot where the old man stood he was on the verge of collapse. Hart is still suffering from the effects of his harrowing experience.
