

MINER BURIED 36 HOURS.

**And Saved Unharmed by Rescuers
After Being Tombed in Coal
Pocket.**

MAHONEY CITY, Pa., April 17.—After being entombed in Hammond Mines for more than thirty-six hours, Richard Brown, a miner, was rescued alive to-day. Hope had practically been abandoned for him when rescuers penetrated the "pocket", where he had been caught behind a heavy fall of coal. Brown was unhurt and except for his enforced abstinence from eating, which had weakened him, is in good condition.
