DEADLY GASES **DELAY RESCUE**

Searching Parties Hindered at Amsterdam, O., Mine

EIGHTEEN IVES ARE LOST

Interior of Shaft Was Wrecked by Terrific Explosion and Ventilation Shut Off-Twelve Bodies Not Yes Located-It is Thought a Minc. Striking a Match Is Responsible For Disaster.

Steubenville, O., April 23.-Th lives of eighteen miners were snuff. out in a tremendous explosion in th. Youghiogheny and Ohio Coal company's mine at Amsterdam.

Seven men, bruised and burned, were rescued from the mine, and their escape from death is regarded as miraculous. The interior of the mine was wrecked and all ventilation shut The cause has not been determined by the state mine inspectors and mining experts who are conducting the search of the wrecked workings for the bodies of twelve victims who have not yet been located.

The dead recovered: "Joe" Zempeddro. Robert McMasters, Herbert Hays, Paul Rosko, "Andy" Rosco, "Joe" Jacob.

The dead still in the mine: Charles Howarth, John Smith, James Lockhart, "Mike" Parcella, Minglo Zangnell, Lonie Colaker, "Joe" Daring. r. | John Daring, Herman Benedict, John Benedict, Reve Locko and Losie Jia Zonnellie.

The night shift of twenty-seven men were working in the mines when the explosion occured. It was known that there was gas in the mine and the men were ordered to take precaution.

Clipped By: usmra_rob Sep 12, 2025 Th belief is that a miners' lamp went out and that he struck a match to relight it. Miners working between the explosion and the opening of the mine were blown out of the tipple where they fell unconscious. Several were badly burned.

The explosion caused a panic among the wives and children of the miners and the shaft was besieged all day. It was found necessary to employ force to prevent the relatives from entering the exploded mine to kep them from hunting the miners. The rescued were all rushed to the hospitals.

EXPERTS SENT TO MINE

Pittsburg, April 23.—The government experimental station here was notified of the mine disaster at Amsterdam, O., and preparations were made to send experts. Engineers of the company went with the government experts.
