

ENTOMBED MINER RESCUED

**Prisoner for Many Hours Reached
by Fellow Workmen**

GIRARDVILLE, Pa., March 2.—Alive and unhurt, John Meducas was today taken from behind hundreds of tons of coal in a breast at McTurks Colliery, where he had been imprisoned since early Monday morning. Except that he suffered slightly the pangs of hunger and thirst he experienced no ill effects from his thrilling experience.

When the rush of coal which entombed him came, Meducas lost his lamp, and during his thirty-six-hour imprisonment, was almost afraid to move lest the first step in the dark be a false one. Never for a moment he says did he doubt that he would be rescued.

Faith in his fellow workmen, whom he felt sure were after him, kept up his spirits.
