

## Victims Adrian Mine Explosion Were Recovered

PUNXSUTAWNEY, Pa., Nov. 11—Delving through a mass of debris into the innermost workings of the Adrian mine of the Rochester and Pittsburgh Coal and Iron company at Adrian, where eight miners perished on Thursday last, workmen at 6:30 o'clock this evening recovered the bodies of Paul Sinoski and Mike Dehannin, the cutter and scraper who had entered the five-mile underground passage way early Thursday morning.

The bodies were found four and three quarter miles in, and more than a quarter of a mile beyond the point of the great fall of slate which was followed by an explosion. The men had evidently gone to the extreme end Dehannin in the lead, as his body was found nearly an eighth of a mile beyond that of Sinoski.

The men evidently had narrowly escaped the explosion and fall of mine roof, their bodies being found beyond the obstruction. Both were badly bruised and cut and the rescuers are inclined to believe that both were on the very edge of the great fall.
