

Miner Buried One Hour Under Slate

Charles Pringle aged 35, a miner employed in the Rose Hill mine at Cannelville, was buried under a pile of slate for an hour about 10 o'clock Wednesday morning, and was so seriously injured that it is believed he will die.

Remains Unconscious

He was unconscious when found by fellow workmen and was still in that condition late Wednesday evening. He was cut and bleeding on all parts of the body when

rescuers finally freed him from the mass of rock. Many bones are broken and his head is badly cut.

Rescuers Work an Hour

The fall of slate was not heard by the other miners in rooms adjoining but his brother heard him groan. He found Pringle with his whole body, with the exception of a small portion of his head, buried under a pile of rocks and coal. Miners worked for an hour in rescuing the unfortunate man.
