

MINER RESCUED FROM LIVING GRAVE NEAR GRASS VALLEY.

Comrades Reach the Entombed Man After Half Hour of Work.

GRASS VALLEY, December 26.—After being buried alive for half an hour this morning, Louis Adge was rescued from a cave of earth and rocks in the Maryland mine, in which he had been working. Adge was at work at the bottom of a stope when a huge mass of earth and rock broke loose from above and fell on him. His comrades believed him to be killed, but went at work with the rescue. After a half hour of frantic work the entombed miner was rescued and is now in a hospital suffering badly from an injured back. It is also feared he is hurt internally.
