

RESCUED TWO BURIED MINERS.
**Quick Work Saved Pennsylvanians When
a Mass of Coal Fell.**

SHENANDOAH, PA., Dec. 23.—Joseph Reed and Thomas Levan, two miners who were entombed in the Packer colliery of the Lehigh Valley coal Company last night, will spend Christmas at home with their families. They were rescued uninjured today.

The men were working on the night shift when there was a rush of coal and refuse, preventing escape. So immense was the wall that mine officials feared it would take several days to dig through and that the men might be asphyxiated if not crushed to death by a further movement of the cave-in. All available men, working in short relays at high speed, made rapid progress and the men soon were reached.
