

MINER FALLS 68 FEET; UNHURT

Sump in Mining Pit Save Man in Long Plunge.

Scranton, Pa., Nov. 24.—(Special.)—To fall down a mine shaft a distance of 68 feet and escape uninjured, except for slight lacerations of the scalp and face, was the unusual experience of Sank Mimce, aged 31 years, of Olyphant.

While standing at the opening of the Delaware and Hudson mine shaft, Mimce suddenly became dizzy and tumbled down the shaft pit. That he was not killed was due to the fact that there was three feet of water at the bottom of the shaft and this broke his fall.
