

TRY TO RESCUE ENTOMBED MINERS

THREE MEN ARE CAUGHT IN
SHAFT AT CRIPPLE CREEK

Two Men Have Been Taken Out, But
Fears for Safety of Others Are
Expressed

CRIPPLE CREEK, Colo., Dec. 2.—
Fighting against tons of rock and dirt,
hundreds of miners working in shifts
of 25 minutes each, struggled today to
reach the three men still entombed in
the Golden Cycle mine here, the prop-
erty of J. T. Milliken of St. Louis, in
which four men were entombed late
yesterday afternoon by a cave-in, and
from which one miner has been res-
cued alive. A fifth miner was en-
tombed in the Christmas mine adjoin-
ing and rescued last night.

Grave fears for the safety of the
men, Frank M. Woods, Patrick Kevan-
ey and Samuel Sorenson, were ex-
pressed this morning by rescuers, who
fear that a second slide had occurred
between them and the imprisoned
men.

Thomas Spindel, one of the im-
prisoned miners, was the first to be
rescued last night. He was at the
eighth level of the Golden Cycle. After
nine hours' work in the Christmas
mine at the fourth level Frank Cabris
was taken out, uninjured.
