

MINER GIVEN UP FOR DEAD RESCUED ALIVE Mike Davasconick, Buried by Cave-in Week Ago, Drank Seepage Water.

SEATTLE, Feb. 23.—Mike Davasco-nick, one of two coal miners who were entombed by a cave-in in the Cannon mine of the Pacific Coast Coal company at Franklin, 34 miles from here, a week ago today, and who was given up for dead several days ago, was rescued alive today.

dead several days ago, was rescued alive today. Although terribly weakened from lack of food, mine physicians say there is every prospect that he will soon recover his normal strength. Since the cave-in last Monday gangs of men bave been working night and day to recover the bodies of the two men buried in the mine. The body of Andrew Chernick was removed from un-der a heap of stone and gravel last Thursday. Although all hope of rescu-ing Davasconick alive was given up at that time the rescue squads were kept at work to recover his body.

Drank Seepage Water.

Drank Seepage Water. Late today the workers removed the debris which blocked the entrance to the chamber in which Davasconick was working at the time of the accident and discovered the miner alive. He had lived for a week on the contents of his dinner nail, which he had with him at the time of the cave-in. He was able to obtain enough water from seepage in the chamber to keep him alive. When Davasconick was carried to the surface his friends, who had gathered about the mouth of the mine in the ex-pectation of seeing his crushed body that they considered a resurrection from the grave.

MINERS ENTOMBED

Little Likelihood That They Will Be Rescued Alive

SEATTLE. Feb. 17.—Rescueres under the direction of James Bagley, state mine insfector, who working to recover Mike Bebasanki and Andrew Chernich, coal miners who are entombed in the Cannon mine of the Pacific Coast Coal company at Franklin, near here, believed there was little likelihood that the men would be rescued alive.

The men were entombed yesterday, when a cave-in in a lower level cut off their escape. Forty other men were working in the same mine when the accident occured and reached safety. A large stream of water is pouring into the mine and hampering the work of the rescue squads.
