

Entombed Miner Saved; Dinner Ready

SALT LAKE CITY, Sept. 20.—After he had been imprisoned several days by a fall of ore in the Eureka-Centennial mine at Eureka, Jacob Timperella, bruised and exhausted, was rescued. He declared he had not suffered greatly by his imprisonment. He was slowly working his way out when found.

His wife, who refused to believe him dead, had prepared supper for him. The table was set when he reached home. Mrs. Timperella remarked simply:

"I knew you'd come."

The rescue of Timperella reduces the death toll to 11. Two bodies have been recovered and three more are in sight. A tangle of fallen timbers makes the work of reaching them dangerous. Those in charge of the rescue work say there is no hope of any other men being alive when reached.
