

MINER'S HEAD IS BURIED IN CAVE

Hugh McCann Narrowly Escapes Stifling in Accident at Central Mine.

His face, shoulders and arms buried in dirt and rock, Hugh McCann, by wiggling his feet, managed to attract the attention of other men in the Central mine yesterday and by quick rescue work escaped possible death. McCann was working in a stope and was cramped in such a position that a large quantity of dirt and rock falling caught him on the head and shoulders, burying that portion of the body. Fortunately the rock fell only a short distance or he would have been killed outright. When the miner was rescued from his painful plight he was almost stifled. Aside from a badly bruised face and slight lacerations of the hand he is none the worse for the accident. His injuries were given attention by Dr. Jones.

Thomas Rodda was caught in a cave at the Empire mine Wednesday night and had two of his ribs on the left side of his body crushed in. Dr. Carl Jones attended him.
