Entombed for Five Days in the Sibley Mine Near Ely.

Found alive beside the body of his dead comrade in the Sibley mine near Ely after five days' hungering, thirsting and half smothering, Joseph Skusik will realize, when he awakes, the desperate hopes he felt when a few hours before he cried out and pounded on the wall of his prison until he fell exhausted and insensible.

He heard the rescuers who for five days had worked unceasingly, digging toward the level where the six men had been walled up by a cavein. This they knew, because they heard him signaling them. From then until the moment the earth wall had been dug through the rescuers worked feverishly.

They found Skusik apparently uninjured. His companion had succumbed to the terrible drain on his vitality. Skusik was barely alive, but he revived rapidly under treatment.
