

# RESCUERS MAKE SLOW PROGRESS AT ELY

**Six Days More Needed to Reach  
the Entombed Miners in  
Sibley Workings.**

ELY, Nov. 13.—Rescue workers at the Sibley mine have succeeded in extending their tunnel downward 16 feet in an effort to reach the six entombed miners. Rock and timbers lying crossways in the shaft have impeded the work so that the progress has been less than one foot per hour on an average.

At this rate it will take six days more to reach their comrades whose dead bodies no doubt lie below. Joe Ribbi, the pumpman who was thrown into the shaft when the timbers gave way and who was picked up torn and bleeding by rescuers who were attracted to the scene by the crash, still lies in the Shipman hospital a badly wounded man. His injuries are about the breast and head. Doctors believe he will recover.
