

## BURIED MINERS SAVED

### Four Men Were Entombed For 24 Hours At Eckhart.

Cumberland, Md., July 28.—After having been imprisoned nearly a mile back in the earth behind 300 feet of fall of roof since shortly after 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon, four American miners—Elmer Kallmyer, 40 years old, of Frostburg; William McLaughlin, 50 years old, and sons, William, Jr., and George McLaughlin, of Eckhart—were rescued unscathed at noon today from Eckhart Mine No. 3 of the Consolidation Coal Company.

State Mine Inspector William Walters headed the rescuing party, which climbed over the fall at great risk and were obliged to remove much debris. The four imprisoned men walked out of the mine little the worse for their experience and sought their homes. After the fall they could be heard talking, and this spurred on the rescuers.
