

ENTOMBED MINER ESCAPED INJURY

Julius Kramitzski, of No. 507 West Cherry street, employed as a miner at Wm. Penn colliery, was closed in at 8:30 o'clock last evening and rescued at 1:30 o'clock this morning without a scratch.

Kramitzski was employed in the West Mammoth vein, No. 1 level. He was engaged in chopping down an old prop when the top gave way, closing him in. His butty, who was working on a lower gangway, gave the alarm and in a short time Superintendent E. A. VanHorn had a force of rescuers at work. The rescuers rapped and received a reply from the entombed man, which encouraged them in their work.

When the entombed man was taken out the First Aid Corps administered stimulants. Krazmitzski said he felt assured of his rescue when he heard the rappings of his rescuers. He said he did not feel any ill effects from his experience.
