

# FOUR MINEDISASTER VICTIMS ARE LAID TO REST

## Funerals of the Other Men Killed in Prospect Colliery Gas Explosion Will Be Held To- day and To-morrow

With a large attendance of fellow mine workers and residents of North Wilkes-Barre, Miner's Mills and Plains, the funerals of four of the thirteen victims of the gas explosion in the Prospect colliery of the Lehigh Valley Coal Co. on Wednesday afternoon, were held yesterday. Funerals of the remaining victims will be held to-day and to-morrow.

The first burial was that of Thomas Bardeski, which was held from his home, 62 Johnson street, Brookside, at 9 o'clock yesterday morning. A requiem high mass was celebrated in St. Stanislaw's Polish Catholic Church by Rev. S. Sobleniowski and interment was in the church cemetery at Plains. With services in Sts. Peter and Paul

Greek Catholic Church at the same hour, the funeral of Bruno Letinski, of Lewis street, Miner's Mills, took place yesterday morning. Rev. Father Spolitakewicz conducted services at the church and at the cemetery at Plains.

With services in the same church yesterday afternoon at 3 o'clock, John Kowalewski, was buried from his home, 12 East Chestnut street. Interment was in the Plains Cemetery. August Welgas, a driver boy, who was fatally burned in the explosion was buried from his home, 803 North Washington street, yesterday afternoon at 2:30. Services were conducted in the Russian Orthodox Church by the pastor, Rev. Father Regalia. Interment was in the Plains Cemetery.
