TRAPPED In West Virginia Mine By Explosion Three Men Are Killed and a Score Seriously Injured. SPECIAL DISPATCH TO THE ENQUIRER. Bluefield, W. Va., March 28.-Three men were killed and 20 or more seriously injured by an explosion in the mine of the King Coal and Coke Company at Kimball, W. Va., at 9 o'clock to-day. It was stated that a number of the injured could not recover. The explosion, which shattered a section in the eastern part of the mine, blew down masses of coal and slate and cut off from escape a large number of men. Rescue crews worked throughout the morning to reach them, and shortly after noon they were released. At 2 p. m. it was stated that all the men who had entered the mine had been accounted for. State Mine Inspectors said the explosion was caused by a shot from the solid. The dead: W. C. Mann, a white miner; William Abbott, slate foreman, and James Tucker, both negroes.
