

ENTOMBED MINER RESCUED

Nanticoke, Pa., March 28.—Utterly exhausted from his three-day entombment in the mines of the Alden Coal company, situated on the mountain-side above this town, Adam Krezinski, a miner, of this place, was rescued by a relief party of fellow workers about 1 o'clock this morning. Company doctors who attended the man say that he will recover.

On Tuesday afternoon, just as they were about to end their day's labor, Krezinski and his laborer, Andrew Bartek, also of Nanticoke, were entombed behind a fall of tons of rock and coal. Immediately workmen were put on the job of removing the debris. Bartek was rescued about 11 o'clock yesterday morning. After hours of work the rescue party were overjoyed late yesterday when they heard Krezinski's voice. Working frantically in relays ever since the fall, they broke through the wall of rock early today and rescued the entombed miner.
