PLYMOUTH, November 28.—Buried fourteen hours by a cave-in at the Plymouth Consolidated Mine here. Vinve Frizonti, a young Italian miner, was rescued by fellow workers at 1 o'clock this afternoon after he had encouraged his rescuers to frantice efforts by tapping upon a pipeline to let them know that he still was alive.

Frizoni was caught in a stope emithe 1000-foot level when the crash came. He was standing by a drilling machine and this prevented the falling rock crushing him to death. Six feet of the stope back on him was filled with rock and dirt. The cavanin occured at 11 o'clock last night.

From that hour Frizonti kept up a frantic tapping upon the pipe while fellow workers moved carload after carload of dirt from the stope. He was unhart except for bruises.
