

## Buried 14 Hours, Miner Is Rescued

PLYMOUTH, November 23.—Buried fourteen hours by a cave-in at the Plymouth Consolidated Mine here, Vinve Frizonti, a young Italian miner, was rescued by fellow workers at 1 o'clock this afternoon after he had encouraged his rescuers to frantic efforts by tapping upon a pipeline to let them know that he still was alive.

Frizoni was caught in a stope on the 1000-foot level when the crash came. He was standing by a drilling machine and this prevented the falling rock crushing him to death. Six feet of the stope back on him was filled with rock and dirt. The cave-in occurred at 11 o'clock last night.

From that hour Frizoni kept up a frantic tapping upon the pipe while fellow workers moved carload after carload of dirt from the stope. He was unhurt except for bruises.
