

MINER IS RESCUED WHEN NEAR DEATH

MARTINS FERRY O., Dec. 11.
—Ross Julian, 40, coal miner, gave thanks for his life tonight to the promptness of the helmet men in effecting his rescue from asphyxiation by black damp in an abandoned mine at Bellaire. Julian said that if the rescuers had been a half-hour later he would have succumbed to the deadly gases.

The man's lamp gave out while he was in the mine and, becoming confused, he walked away from the mouth of the mine. He wandered around in the darkness for several hours and was beginning to lose consciousness when mine inspectors, apprised of his disappearance by fellow miners, reached him.
