

FIVE KILLED IN CLINTON MINE

TWO KILLED BY EXPLOSION AND
THREE MEMBERS OF RESCU-
ING PARTY DIE IN SUB-
MARINE MINE.

MINE OWNED BY FERGUSON & SPEARS

Lee Stewart of Carbon, Among the
Miners Who Were Badly Burned
by the Explosion—Mine
Boss is Killed.

CLINTON Ind., May 3.— Five
men are dead and six injured, two
probably fatally, as the result of a
gas explosion in the Ferguson-Spears
coal mine, south of here Saturday.
The dead are:

ANDREW WILSON of Clinton,
mine boss.

JOHN HOWE, of Terre Haute,
pumper.

JAMES SMITH of Clinton.

ART THOMPSON of Terre Haute.

FRANK HUGHES of Clinton.

The injured are:

JOHN WHITMARSH of Clinton.

ROBERT MONTGOMERY of Clin-
ton.

ELI FULKERSON, Terre Haute.

Wilson and Howe were killed by
the explosion and Smith, Thompson
and Hughes were victims of after
damp while attempting to rescue the
body of Howe. Needham was also a
member of the rescue party. The
other injured were seriously burned
by the explosion. The accident is
believed to have been caused by an
open miner's lamp.

Only forty men were working
Saturday. From 200 to 250 men
are ordinarily employed. Efforts
made directly after the explosion to
get the mine rescue car were unsuc-
cessful. The victims were all mar-
ried men and have families. The mine was not badly damaged
and it will be possible to resume op-
erations in a few days.
