

ENTOMBED MINER SAVED; DIRECTS RESCUE PARTY

WILKESBARRE, Pa., June 18.—

Pleading with the rescue force to save him, and urging them on, Louis Buffalino, a miner who was caught in a cave-in at South Scranton, yesterday was taken out alive. All the time the rescue party was at work, Buffalino kept uttering comforting words to his grief-stricken wife, who stood at the edge of the cave-in watching the work.

Buffalino and a companion, Pasquale Ballino, employed in the National mine, were imprisoned when a surface vein gave way. Ballino was crushed to death.
