

Miner Is Rescued After 18 Hours In Dirt and Rock Cavein

DENVER, Dec. 4.—Imprisonment for 9 hours beneath a hundred tons of caved in rock and dirt in the Fox coal mine, at Marshall, Colorado, Kenneth Baldwin, 30 years old, of Superior, Colo., was brot out alive and uninjured, according to a dispatch to the Denver Post today. An hour after the cavein Baldwin's companions were so certain that he was dead that they called Coroner A. E. Hall of Boulder, the dispatch said.

A companion miner in the same stope with Baldwin barely escaped the slide and rushed thru the mine calling to other miners. Fifty men started the work of rescue.

The rescue work continued with halts and occasionally the workers heard a feeble shout, according to the dispatch. Efforts were redoubled and the last ton of debris was shoveled away at midnight and Baldwin, weak and disheveled, was brot out of the mine safe safely.
