ORDER 12 COFFINS FOR MEN CAUGHT IN BIG MINE BLAST Heavy Shot of Dynamite Is Presumed To Have Caused **Explosion of Dust** BODIES RESCUERS GET HUNTINGTON, W. Va., Feb. 8 .-Twelve coffins were rushed to the mines of the Marietta Coal Co., at

Pinney Fork, where nine men are dead and several severely injured in a dynamite and dust explosion, which occurred last night.

The known dead are: Oscar Nunilly, Paul Nunilly, Kelly Lockhart, J. Ains and Frank Ains. Four men are upidentified Pinney Fork, where nine men are

are unidentified.

John Algo was brought to the Williamson hospital.

Three men so far unidentified are said to be at the mine.

Call for 12 Coffins
M. P. Ball, Williamson undertaker, was asked early today to send
12 caskets to the Marietta mine. He was told nine had been instantly killed and three were expected to die.

A crew of 12 men at the time of the accident were blowing out coal preparatory to its removal today. A heavy "shot" of dynamite was put off in a deep recess of the mine.

According to the information, the release of the manufactured to the second to the

explosive was not well tamped, resulting in a "windy" shot.

Fire from the blast ignited coal dust. A blinding explosion followed.

Most of the crew were instantly killed.

Rescuers Obtain Bodies
Because of the sloping situation
of the mine, rescuers had little difficulty in removing the bodies last

night and carly today.

Relief parties are still digging into the debris in an effort to locate other bodies, but the opinion was expressed that all bodies have been taken out.

The blast occurred about 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon.

As the blasters were "putting off" their first shot of the night shift, a terrific explosion occurred. Heavy rocks, timbers and wreckage were hurled high into the air out of the minester as a piller of the size of the state. mineshaft as a pillar of fire and smoke flashed upward. The Marietta mine is a small op-

eration owned by W. E. Deegans, of Huntington.
