

Miner Is Buried Ten Hours But Comes Out Entirely Uninjured

SEATTLE, Wash., Sept. 2.—After being buried alive for ten hours, Mike Pedlock, Issaquah coal miner, was back at work today none the worse for his experience.

While working in a coal chute yesterday Pedlock was caught by an avalanche of coal that buried the entrance to the chute forty feet deep.

Although sure that he had been killed by the slide, comrades worked unceasingly to rescue him. About dark they broke through the wall and found Pedlock. A crevice in the chute had admitted plenty of air, and hunger was the only inconvenience he had suffered.
