

## BURIED BY SALT CAVE-IN; RESCUED

**Lyons Salt Works Employee May  
Die, However, From the  
Injuries Received.**

Lyons, April 6.—D. Lego, a workman at the Bevis salt plant, was buried for nearly ten minutes under a huge mass of table salt, in a cave-in at a bin.

Although he was rescued alive, it is expected he cannot recover. He is at the Lyons hospital.

Lego was in a bin, shoveling the salt, when a carload of it was dumped in. The salt, when dumped, usually runs in slowly and gives the workman time to get out of the way, but this time it came down in a large quantity and Lego could not escape. He was working alone, but his scoop shovel, traveling down the chute, attracted the attention of a fellow workman, Frank Rollez, stationed at another point, and he rushed to the scene.

It was almost ten minutes before Lego could be recovered, and he had lost consciousness. He was taken to the Lyons hospital, where it was found that his injuries consisted of lungs filled with salt and minor bruises.
