TRAPPED MINER RESCUED

Hazleton Worker Imprisoned 11 Hours by Cave-in, Escapes Injury Special to The Inquirer.

HAZLETON, Pa., May 17.—Imprisoned by a cave-in at the mouth of the No. 7 slope at the Coleraine Mine of the A. S. Van Winkle Estate, at two o'clock this morning, John Harris, 65-year-old pump runner on duty at the bottom of the shaft, was rescued alive and unhurt at one o'clock this afternoon, and taken home in the automobile of his son, Gordon Harris, of Hazleton.

A crowd cheered as Harris came forth with the rescuing party, which started operations as soon as the accident was reported, and dug through piles of debris to reach him. Harris said he had felt no fears for his safety. He is the father of Benjamin Harris, a former secretary treasurer of the United Mine Workers of the Seventh distict.
