

HOUSE TO PRESS BILL PROPOSING PROBE OF BLAST IN DAWSON MINE

Undiscouraged by Two Fail-
ures, Advocates of the
Measure Will Make a
Third Attempt Today

DEMOCRATIC LEADER PREDICTS SUCCESS

Zinn Introduces a Resolu-
tion Providing for Merger
of the Higher Institutions
of Learning

Santa Fe, Feb. 27.—Undiscour-
aged by two failures, the advo-
cates of the house bill providing
for a legislative investigation of
the Dawson mine explosion will
make a third attempt tomorrow to
get two-thirds majority for the
measure in order to be able to at-
tach the emergency clause. The
second effort was made today
when the bill passed yesterday was
recalled from the senate and re-
passed. The roll call, however,
showed a vote of only 23 to 16 for
the affirmative and the emergency
clause again defeated. Those op-
posing the investigation declared
this was a virtual defeat for the
plan. Democratic Floor Leader
Howard, however, said late today
that some of the opposition had
been won over and the third effort
tomorrow would succeed.
