

BODY OF LAST MAN FOUND IN DAWSON MINE

Dawson, N. M., Feb. 20.—Mucking crews which have been working in the ruins of Dawson mine Number One of the Phelps-Dodge corporation here, damaged in a coal dust explosion February 8, today found the body of the last of the 120 miners who were killed when the blast occurred.

Two miners walked out of the workings alive on the morning following the explosion, after lying all night with their faces immersed in water soaked sweaters. Officials have announced that the work of cleaning up the debris in the mine will be continued, to permit resumption of production as soon as possible.
