### Sprinkler InDawson Mine Was FrozenUp

Haulways Dusty for Five Days, Enabling Explosion to Spread, Inspector Says.

A sweeping investigation of the Dawson disaster, which cost the lives of 120 men in the Phelps Dodge Corporation's No. 1 mine, Feb. 8, will be proposed in the house this afternoon, according to announcement made by Democratic Leader Howard and Rep. Edgar F Puryear.
A joint resolution will be introduced, they said, to provide for the appointment of an investigating committee to be made up of two members of the boundard two members of the senate, to be named by the house and senate; and to provide for the appointment by Governor Hinkle and attorney General Helmick of a special counsel to work with the committee and also to take steps to prosecute in case any violations of the law are brought to light.
This announcement came after Howard, Puryear and other members read over State Mine Inspector W. W. Ridon's report on the Dawson disaster.

That coal dust had been permitted to accumulate in the Phelps-Dodge corporation's No. 1 mine at Dawson; that the pipe line of the sprinkling system had been frozen for five days and there had been no water on the "roads" to lay the dust for five days prior to the explosion of Peb 8 that. while the explosion was set off accidentally, this condition allowed it roreach the innermost reaches of the mine, thousands of feet underground, anuff out the lives of 120 men and damage the mine to such an extent that no coal can be produced for months.

months.

This, in effect, is State Mine Inspector W. W. Risdon's report on the disaster of Feb. 8, one of the most terrible in New Mexico's mining history, which he filed at Governor Hinkle's office today.

There seems to be no reason to doubt the blast was a "dust explosion."
Risdon says. At least, he was unable to find any indication that it was caused by gas in his investigation immediately-afterward.

In regard to the accumulation of dust he says:

"It had been the practice to wet

"It had been the practice to wet down the sides and floor of the haulage ways, but on account of the bad effect of the water on the top of the timbers and roof of the entries were not washed. This practice of not wetting down the roof permitted the dust to accumulate on top of the cross bars and in the cavities in the roof.

"I have been told by men in charge of the mine that on Saturday, Feb. 3, five days before the explosion occurred, someone closed a valve in the pipe line, thus shutting off the sprays and stopping the flow of water through the pipes. The extreme cold weather of Saturday night, Sunday and Sunday snight froze the water in the pipe line and therefore, the mine had not had any water on the roads for five days preceding the explosion." The starting point of the explosion was in the main entry, about 1.500 feet underground, according to Risdon. Here several cars in a string of 34, being hauled out at a high rate of speed by an electric locomotive, left the rails, knocked down three sets of timbers, pulled down the feed wire One of the cars, immediately behind the locomotive, was loaded with "bug dust," or machine cuttings. At the instant of the derailment the air was filled with dust-an explosive mixture. According to his theory, the spark to ignite it was supplied when the charged feed wire dropped on one of the iron cars or rails. Risdon then says: "The explosion started at this point on the main entry, traveled out to the mouth and at the same time inward on the main artery to the north and south entries and on to the faces of these entries. The accumulation of fine dust on the top of the cross-bars and in the crevices in the roof, together with the accumulation of dust on the roadways (from lack of sprinkling) furnished sufficient fuel to propagate the explosion throughout the mine," The inspector then tens how two of the 122 men in the mine at the time escaped, the sole survivors of the disaster: "Promptness in restoring ventilation to the fourth north entry prevented the two men, who walked out of the mine 17 hours after the explosion. from being suffocated by after-damp.
