

WRECKED MINE GIVES UP MORE BURNED BODIES

**Three Additional Victims
Are Taken From Bar-
rackville Property, Scene
of Tuesday's Explosion**

FAIRMONT, W. Va., March 20.
—Three additional bodies were re-
moved this morning from wrecked
mine No. 41 of the Bethlehem Mines
corporation at Barrackville, where
thirty-four men were entombed
Tuesday night when an explosion
occurred.

The three bodies taken from the
mine this morning were badly
burned from the fire that followed
the blast. Two other bodies had been
removed last night.

They are victims of the terrific
explosion at the property Tuesday
night, which entombed thirty-one
miners. All who were in the mine
at the time of the blast are believed
to have been killed. The mine is
at Barrackville, three miles from
Fairmont.

The bodies brought out were
badly burned and were identified
after considerable difficulty.

Rescue workers found the bodies
far back in the left heading near a
point where fire was discovered.
The fire, it was said by officials,
has been extinguished.

Twelve men were working in the
left heading when the explosion oc-
curred and twenty-two were in the
right heading. The work of rescue
has been confined to date to the left
heading and no effort has been
made to penetrate the other.
