

ENTOMBED MINERS FREED BY THEIR OWN EFFORTS

TRENTON, Mo., Nov. 13.—(A.P.)
—Seven miners early tonight dug their way to freedom after having been entombed for eleven hours more than 200 feet underground by a cave-in of the shaft of the Trenton Coal Mine.

They were none the worse for their experiences. They had taken food into the mine with them and there was ample air supply.

Rescue workers, who had dug feverishly at the fallen earth and rock shutting the men in, heard the click of shovels on the other side of the barrier late today. Soon the entombed miners tunneled through to the open passage.
