Funerals of Men Killed in Gas Explosion at Woodward Colliery Held From Respective Homes

The funerals of three victims of the Woodward mine disaster were held yesterday from their respective homes. The funeral of Frank Dugan was held yesterday morning at 9:30 o'clock from the home, Northampton street, Kingston. A high mass of requiem was celebrated in St. Mary's Lithuanian Church, Kingston, by Rev. George Inczura. Numerous floral offerings were carried by John Romanofsky, Martin McClosky, Louis Victor, William Wallace and the Misses Mary Sobers, Kate Victor, Kate Nelson, Mary Nelson.
