

Jerome Man Buried In Mine Is Rescued But Dies Of Shock

JEROME, Ariz., May 13.—(A. P.)—Caught in a slip of the muck and buried on the 2,150-foot level of the United Verde mine here yesterday afternoon, William Scarlett, 31, Boston mining engineer, was rescued alive at 1 o'clock this morning only to die from shock at daylight.

Scarlett was buried in ore when he was carried down into the raise, but talked with his rescuers up until the hour they took him out, apparently little injured. He was a graduate of Tufts college and the Montana school of mines, and was to have been married to a local school teacher next month.

Scarlett was a former service man, an active member of the American Legion and acted as "jigger boss" at the mine.
