

Both Good Leg and Wooden Leg Are Broken

Miner Caught Under Fall of Slate

Benjamin Rosman, of Millwood, a miner employed at the Clarence Lozier mine, at New Derry, suffered a fracture of his right leg, and had an artificial leg smashed off, near the hip, when he and his brother, William Rosman, were caught under a ton rock, which fell from the roof as they were at work, about 11:30 o'clock, yesterday morning.

William Rosman suffered a fracture of the right ankle. Both men were brought to the Latrobe hospital.

Benjamin Rosman had just raised his pick into the air, intending to test the roof, to see if it would be necessary to put up a pit post. The huge rock fell down without warning, pinning both men under it. The rock fell across Benjamin's legs, above the knees, and William's right leg was caught. The rock was eight feet square and weighed a ton.

Benjamin Rosman had his left leg cut off in a railroad accident, a number of years ago.

Man Fined \$200 For Contempt
