

IMPRISONED MINER HAS BEEN RESCUED

Rescuers who worked more than ten hours yesterday in an effort to release Julian Jecken, a miner who was imprisoned in the Turkey Run colliery after being caught under a fall of rock and coal, effected a release of the man late last night. He was removed at once to the Locust Mountain State hospital, where it is said he is suffering from contusions and a possible fracture of the pelvis, lacerations on the forehead. He was treated by the company surgeon of the Philadelphia and Reading Coal and Iron Company immediately after being released from his precarious position. Jecken was working in the mine early yesterday afternoon. He was caught by a fall of the rock and coal and was imprisoned. When rtscue squads were formed they feared that the imprisoned man would not be rescued alive due to the hurts that he would probably suffer when caught under the mass. The injured man's condition is reported as serious.
