

March 26, Edward Moorehead, miner, age 52 years, married, was killed in O'Gara Coal Company's No. 12 mine by a fall of slate. He leaves a widow and one child.

March 30, an explosion of gas occurred in the No. 2 mine of the Saline County Coal Corporation in which eight men lost their lives. The information concerning these men follows:

Claud Lunch, age 26, leaves a widow and one child.

William Felber, age 44, leaves a widow and three children.

George Ambrose, age 25, single.

Cecil Reynolds, age 19, single.

Lee Morris, age 30, leaves a widow and three children.

Simon Simaitis, age 48, leaves a widow and three children.

Peter Dorris, age 56, leaves a widow and one child.

Joseph Toth, age 44, leaves a widow.

April 6—Ira W. Gibson, assistant manager, age not given, married, was electrocuted in O'Gara Coal Company's No. 8 mine. He leaves a widow and one child.

September 9, Thomas Lippiatt, miner, age 22 years, married, was killed by a fall of rock, in Saline County Coal Corporation's No. 7 mine. He leaves a widow and one child.

October 11, Melvin Graves, miner, age 45 years, married, died from injuries received the day before by a fall of rock in O'Gara Coal Company's No. 1 mine. He leaves a widow.

October 19, John Nozzy, miner, age 44 years, single, died from injuries received the day before, in Wasson Coal Company's No. 1 mine. Deceased suffered a severe rupture caused from lifting a heavy lump of coal onto a car which he was loading. He was taken to the hospital and operated upon, but without beneficial result.

October 21, Charles Vinyard, miner, age 22 years, married, was caught in a mining machine and killed, in J. K. Dering Coal Company's mine. He leaves a widow and one child.

November 22, Jesse Russel, miner, age 24 years, single, was killed in Saline County Coal Corporation's No. 4 mine, by falling in front of trip and being run over by a car. He leaves his mother and sister dependent.

December 1, Aron Franklin, miner, age 35 years, married, died from injuries received the day before, in O'Gara Coal Company's No. 1 mine. Deceased was standing in entrance to room when driver passed by with some cars, on one of which was a pair of rails. The rails struck a prop and swung around, striking him, resulting in his death. He leaves a widow and one child.

December 2, Albert Harris, trackman, age 53 years, married, died from injuries received one week earlier when caught between motor and trap door in Saline County Coal Corporation's No. 4 mine. He leaves a widow.
