

## 40 TO 50 MEN TRAPPED IN MINE RESCUED

SCRANTON, Penna., Oct. 13. (P) —Between forty and fifty miners, trapped in the Peck mine of the Glendale Coal Company at noon today, were rescued tonight. All were in good condition and apparently suffered but slightly from their imprisonment.

The men were shut off from the outside world when a wheel in the tower of the colliery collapsed, dropping the heavy steel cable holding a mine cage filled with rock. The cage ran wild down the shaft and became wedged just above the Hudak vein, which is the upper level of the mine and 200 feet below the surface.

More than 200 workers in two lower veins got out through an opening so small, that some of the stouter miners had their clothing torn off as they were pulled through the tiny holes in the earth. The men in the Hudak vein, however, had no other way out except through the main shaft and were forced to wait until the obstruction could be cleared.
