NINE ENTOMBED MINERS SAVED AFTER 12 HOURS

Rescue Workers Dig Way to Them Over Fallen Coal Barrier in Oneida (Pa.) Slope.

HAZLETON, Pa., Tuesday, Jan. 17 (A).—Just before 2 o'clock this morning the nine entombed men who were caught behind a rush of coal in the No. 1 Oneida mine at 1:30 o'clock yesterday afternoon were rescued. None of the men suffered any injuries or appeared weakened by his

ordeal of more than twelve hours' imprisonment.

Officials of the company announced last night that a barrier of coal more than fifty feet in thickness had blocked the gangway. A hole about four feet in height was driven over this fall of coal to allow the men an avenue of escape.
