

## CAUGHT IN RUSH OF COAL AT KEHLEY RUN

**Rescued by Colliery Employees,  
But Not Much Hurt.**

John Burgness, of town, who was picking coal on the rock bank of the Kehley Run colliery this afternoon, was caught in a rush and was buried to his hips for about one-half hour before rescue workers could remove him from a very dangerous position.

The men who formed the rescue party had to work very carefully due to the condition of the mine breach in which Burgness was held prisoner. They finally succeeded in getting the man out of the hole and to safety.

It was said at the Kehley Run colliery office that the man was not injured. The accident occurred about 1,000 feet east of the breaker, it was said.
